Cooking Through the Calendar

August— Peanut Butter Oatmeal Bites

Ingredients:

1 cup creamy peanut butter

2/3 cup unsweetened applesauce or 2 large ripe Bananas (or half of each)

1/3 cup brown sugar

2 tsp. vanilla

2 tsp. cinnamon

3/4 cup dried fruit—(cranberries, raisins, apples, dates, etc. or mixture)

1/2 cup chopped nuts, pepitas (pumpkin seeds), Or sunflower seeds (or a mixture)

Directions:

- 1. Wash hands with warm water and soap, scrubbing at least 20 seconds.
- 2. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F.
- 3. Line two large baking sheets with parchment paper and set aside.
- In a large bowl, mix the peanut butter, applesauce or bananas, brown sugar, vanilla and cinnamon until smooth. Add the oats, dried fruit and nuts, stirring until combined.
- 5. Drop the dough into equal sizes onto the baking sheets about 2 Tbsp. per cookie. Flatten the top with the back of a spoon.
- 6. Bake 12 to 16 minutes or until the edges are slightly brown and the dough is set, but soft.
- Remove from the oven and cool on the baking sheet for 10 minutes. Transfer to a cooling rack to finish cooling.
- 8. Store in an airtight container. Use within four days or freeze.
